1. Bertha Landis I loved being mayor of Seattle-- even if Puddletown wasn't dancing then (1924).
2. Carrie Catt I hope you like my voters' guides-- my League of Women Voters started 1920.
3. Christine Quintasket I wrote a novel describing Native American life at the turn of the 20th century.
4. Dorothy Eustis My 1928 organization helped the blind achieve more rewarding lives..
5. Dorothy Parker When you're in NY, look me (or my spirit) up at the Algonquin on 44th St.
6. Dorothy Todd My partner Madge and I transformed Vogue in the '20's.
7. Edith Wharton Thank you, Pulitzer, for finally awarding your fiction prize to a woman (1921).
8. Elsa Gidlow My lesbian love poetry published in 1923 was a first for the U.S. of A.
9. Florence King Long before Sandra Day O'Connor, I was the first woman to win a case in the Supreme Court in 1923.
10. Genevieve Cline Leading the way (1928) for O'Connor, Ginsberg, Sotomayor, Kagan, and Jackson, I was the first woman appointed a federal judge.
11. Georgia Douglas Johnson Several of my poems were published by DuBois' The Crisis in the 1920's.
12. Georgia O'Keefe Although other paintings are better known, many love my 1920's NY skylscapes.
13. Gertrude Ederle My name became synonymous with swimming the English Channel.
14. Gertrude Stein Hemingway, Picasso, Pound? All good friends who drop in to my place.
15. Huda Shaarawi In the 20's I helped my Egyptian sisters throw off the veil.
16. Jane Addams Although best known for a Chicago institution, I also co-founded ACLU in 1920
17. Josephine Baker I was THE sensation of Paris in the 1920's!
18. Ma Rainey I'm renowned for one of my bare anatomical parts, but in the '20's I was the “Mother of the Blues.”
19. Zora Neal Hurston I co-founded the Harlem Renaissance magazine, Fire!! (along with Langston Hughes & Wallace Thurman.)
