<u>Secretary's Report</u> – Vinney (report submitted)

Motion (Steve/Coco seconded): Accept November 2022 Minutes? Yes: 5. No: 0. Abstain: 0

Treasurer's Report – Chris (report submitted)

Treasurer's 2022 Year-end report discussed. Key take-away: In 2022, the club made a profit. It was acknowledged that a loss was avoided because of the profits from the Fly-in.

Motion (Steve/Vinney seconded): Accept Treasurer's Report? Yes: 5. No: 0. Abstain: 0

Members discussed the finance committee's recommendation to move money to an interest-bearing account. Live Oak Banks, which is 100% online, is one possibility. It was suggested that we leave \$8K in PNC and put \$32K into a CD and \$2K in a Money Market Account. 3 months interest for withdrawing funds before 1 year. We also discussed closing out the reserve account. **Motion (Steve/Chris seconded): Close reserve account?** *Yes:* 6. *No:* 0. *Abstain:* 0

<u>Fly-In Report</u>— Vinney (report submitted)

Co-chair reminded the group of the upcoming Fly-in Committee meeting. It was suggested that we add a bullet to the agenda to discuss a free registration for the Ottawa convention and whether masks will still be necessary for the Fly-in.

Return to Dance Committee—Peg (report submitted)

Members discussed if current cleaning protocols need to be amended.

Motion (Chris/Dave seconded): No more wiping down tables, pens, doorknobs, or other surfaces: Yes: 6 No: 0 Abstain. 0

Committee chairs discussed if modifying the current weekly COVID report, as a result of current trends and availability of reliable data.

Motion (Steve/Vinney seconded): Change weekly stats report to bi-weekly, and display only new cases, hospitalizations, and ICU admissions. *Yes:* 6 *No:* 0 *Abstain:* 0

The necessity of tracking the dates of COVID vaccinations was discussed.

Motion (Steve/Coco): Amend the IS waiver to cease collecting vaccination dates. Yes: 6 No: 0 Abstain: 0.

Members discussed whether to have a potluck dinner at the 2023 Glitter Ball. Some felt it was burdensome for those who must warm up/serve food. Others felt that the dinner allows dancers and callers a time to refuel and recuperate. It was also noted that we shouldn't underestimate the social value of the potluck dinner, as we are a social organization. A decision had not been made.

* <u>Action Item #1</u>: President to speak to Mike and Linda about changing Glitter Ball 2023 to 3-7pm, instead of 4-8pm.

* <u>Action Item #2</u>: RTD Chairs to put together safety guidelines for outdoor activities (e.g., no masks required).

Caller Liaison – Linda and Mike (report submitted)

Chair reminded members that the venue for February will be at the Holy Communion Church at 2111 Sansome Street (it was subsequently confirmed that the April dance will be held there, too). Members will continue thinking about cohosting future events with DC Lambda, Chesapeake Squares, and Times Squares. We also discussed whether the pool of callers for the Glitter Ball and other special events should be expanded.

MOTION: Board approves committee's recommendation to hold the 2024 Glitter Ball on December 7, 2024 and will accept their judgement for whom they want to hire as caller. Yes: 5. No. 0. Abstain: 1

2023/2024 Classes & Workshops: Club President recommended that IS consider offering Mainstream, Plus and Advanced classes and a Challenge Workshop for the 2023/2024 season. Due to time limitations, he suggested we continue the conversation at the next Board meeting.

Recruitment Committee Report – Steve (no report)

President/Chair discussed ideas for upcoming dances and the possibility of resurrecting the Fun Dances, perhaps outdoors with a different format. He also suggested that future advertisements include QR codes that directs interested parties to our website.

Independence Squares Fly-In Committee Report January 12, 2023

We have 98 registrations as of 1/8/23 and 70 room nights booked as of the same date. We are responsible for 100 room nights with an attrition rate of 80%.

Our hotel contact has confirmed that we will not be permitted to hold any dancing in the pool area. She is working to see if we can get the bar hours extended for at least one evening. Additionally, she has fixed the reservation link so that dancers can book rooms for up to 3 days early or stay for up to 3 days later and receive our special room rate.

An ad was included in the latest Delaware Valley Federation newsletter and will be included as well in the next All Join Hands mailing.

We have exchange certificates from Times Squares, Boots In Squares, and DCLS. We also have commitments from Hotlanta, Suncoast Squares, Chesapeake Squares, and Chi-Town. Ron will continue to reach out to other clubs that have annual Fly-Ins.

The Fly-In committee will meet next on January 16.

Return to Dance Committee Report to IS Board

REVISED & UPDATED Minutes November 30, 2022, Return to Dance Committee Meeting

The RTD Committee is proposing to the IS board to consider reassessing these protocols:

- Wiping down surfaces before and after classes
- Reporting weekly statistics on COVID
- Mask wearing requirments
- Tracking dates of vaccinations

Wiping Proposal

• Cease the effort of wiping down surfaces before and after weekly dance class.

The coronavirus behind the pandemic can linger on doorknobs and other surfaces, but these aren't a major source of infection. We implemented a protocol to wipe down surfaces before and after class to be proactive with preventing the spread of monkeypox virus at square dance classes. Monkeypox is not as widespread in the greater Philadelphia area as was feared. Monkeypox incidence has fallen in Philadelphia to fewer 10 new cases on October 31, 2022. There is an effective vaccine for monkeypox, which really helps with control of spread of monkeypox.

Statistics Reports Proposal

• Cease weekly reporting of some (but not all) of the data points currently being tracked

To help inform the IS board in making decisions about meeting in person for dance class and dances, the RTD committee starting tracking COVID statistics. RTD committee tracked incidence, positivity results, vaccination rates, deaths due to COVID, and community risk levels. Recently we added tracking hospitalization and ICU admissions for COVID patients and percentage of hospital beds occupied by COVID patients.

RTD Committee proposes that we stop tracking COVID incidence, testing and vaccination rates, deaths, hospital bed occupancy and community risk level as there is no current data or the data is not significantly different week to week.

- As of September 21, 2022 CDC has stopped collecting testing data and positivity rates in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware.
- Community risk level is based on weekly new reported cases per 100K, weekly covid admissions per 100K, and the percent of staffed inpatient beds occupied by covid patients.
- If we no longer track new reported cases and we are not tracking inpatient bed use, the community risk level is not a useful tool.
- We stopped tracking deaths due to COVID since there has been a drop in death rates in 2022 with virtually no change since we started tracking death rates in June 2022.

RTD Committee proposes to continue to report on:

- Hospitalization (which is different from bed occupancy) and ICU admission to track severity of illness
- RTD Committee proposes to report on a revised schedule of Bi-weekly or monthly or only when there is a significant change

Mask Wearing Proposal – Continue current practice

 Continue monitoring COVID cases and continue discussion on mask wearing during our classes and dances

RTD Committee proposes that the RTD Committee and the IS Board continue to monitor and discuss COVID and consider reassessing the mask wearing requirement during classes and dances in the future. Point of information: DC Lambda Squares recently went mask-optional. However, their club requires proof of COVID vaccination, 2 boosters, and the bi-valent booster, which is more stringent than IS requirements. **And as of January 2023, they returned to requiring masks for their dances.

Making mask wearing optional might make the club more attractive to younger dancers.

Also, if we have any outdoor dances in warm weather (Gay Pride events or other show cases) the strict protocols can be relaxed. RTD Committee would develop protocols for outdoor dances if the IS board would like to schedule such events.

Vaccine Date Tracking Proposal

• Revise the IS waiver and Release of Liability to cease tracking the dates of vaccinations and boosters.

It was important early on during the COVID pandemic to track dates of vaccination to note when a person was eligible for the second dose or booster. This is no longer as important since we are requiring two vaccinations plus a booster, so the dates of eligibility are no longer needed.

RTD Committee proposes that a revised waiver be used. The revised waiver would include fields for a club officer to indicate:

- that the vaccination records were checked and are in line with our current protocols
 - o remove the section for recording the vaccination dates
- Photo ID was checked
- Initials of the club representative who verified the information

The person signing the waiver would include this identifying information:

- Signature
- Printed name
- Date signed
- Phone number
- Email address

Once the signed waivers are scanned into a secure drive, the paper copies would be destroyed.



Daily new cases per 100k population

Daily new cases, also known as incidence, is the number of new COVID cases emerging each day in a location. This is measured by the number of positive test results, and it does not include individuals who are infected but asymptomatic or never get tested.

Positive test rate

Positive test rate is the percentage of COVID tests that come back positive. It measures both the severity of COVID and the limitations of testing. If a place has a high positive test rate, it is a sign of insufficient testing in that area. Positive test rate does *not* include at-home positive test data.

Testing a larger number of at-risk populations (essential workers, people notified via contact tracing, etc.) is key to catching unknown infections before they can lead to an outbreak.



Change in Club COVID Protocols

After lengthy discussion at Board Meetings and input from club members, the Board is revising the Club's mask policy. Subject to a mask requirement by the church, masks will be optional at DCLS dances so long as DC's numbers reported to the CDC remain low. In addition to this change, all attendees MUST be completely up-to-date with Covid boosters, including the bivalent, by January 1, 2023.
